I'm enclosing five francs (worth about 10¢) so you can see what it looks like. This is invasion money issued by the U.S. government and used as legal tender in France. The regular French money is much larger.

Although it's only 8 o'clock, I think I'll go to bed. I played football again this afternoon and I'm kind of tired.

As yet I haven't had a chance to write to everyone, so show my letters to Shirley, Bea + the rest.
